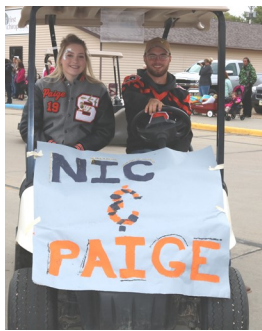
Grades K, 1, 2 should wear their dressed-up concert clothes for the concert.

The Scholastic Book Fair 2018 was a success. We have done several things in conjunction with the fair that was great. The 1st thing we did was a change war with all of the classrooms participated. We raised \$1,369.40. That money went back into the classrooms libraries. The Kindergarten won a popcorn/movie party for raising the most money of \$210.55 in the elementary. The Farmers and Merchants State Bank of Scotland matched that winning amount of \$210.55 which was used to buy more books for the classroom libraries. We thank the bank for doing that. The 6th grade class won in the middle school with \$117.41.

The 2nd thing we did was a coloring contest in the elementary. All of the elementary did an awesome job. We displayed all of the winning sheets on the walls outside the classrooms for all of the parents to see.

The 3rd thing we did was the PTO donated \$10.00 to each of the classroom libraries.

We did All For Books Program through the Scholastic Book Fair Company and they match the money that we raised through our change war and the PTO in which the company will donate books to various organizations to help out children so they will also have books to read.

The Library hosted an Open House for the community during the book fair

During the Book fair, we invited community members to come in to the classrooms and read to the students. We had a great turnout of community readers. Thank You!!

BIG MULTIPLICATION TEST for FIFTH GRADE

We finished our first and second chapter in math which reviewed Place Value, Multiplication, and Expressions. In Chapter 2, we divided with one and two digit divisors. In Chapter 3, we are adding and subtracting decimals with numbers into the thousandths place. It won't be long and we will be adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing fractions. So it is *imperative* that your child knows all their basic facts well. Please continue to work on the multiplication facts. The students are improving, but we need to become fluent with this skill. There will be a reward (movie and root beer floats) for those students who are able to complete 100 multiplication facts with 90% accuracy in three minutes. (Those who do not pass with a 90% or better, will be working on flash cards or some other type of multiplication work.) **This test will be Friday, November 16, 2018.** Please help your child become fluent in their math facts. This will help them tremendously in the thought process of multiplying and dividing larger numbers. Thank you. If you have any questions or concerns, please call or email me.

"I Can Handle It!"

K-3rd Grade: This book taught us about problem solving! The phrase "I Can Handle It" it empowers students to think about how they can handle any problem that comes their way. Many times, they get into the habit of telling an adult right away instead of seeing if they can solve the problem on their own first. For our activity we practiced coming up with three different solutions to each problem, and realized that we can handle ANYTHING!

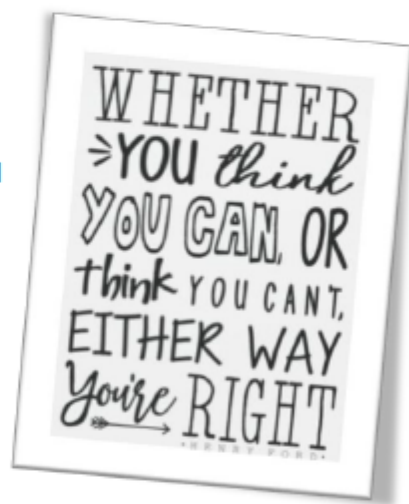
"We can train our brains to handle anything, anytime, anywhere!

Positive Self Talk

4th and 5th Grade: This is a two part lesson in which we first learned that self talk is all of the thoughts and words we say about ourselves.

We talked about how our thoughts influence our: self confidence, feelings, behavior, motivation, productivity and overall well being. Our thoughts are a big deal and can affect many aspects of our life! We need to make sure that our thoughts and self talk are positive rather than negative. We learned that our positive thoughts can help us through tough times, make us feel encouraged and motivated, and help us to do our very best. However, negative thoughts can hold us back. They can make you feel bad about yourself and keep you from being productive and moving forward. We all want to grow and move forward, right?

Even if you tend to be more negative right now, it's not too late to change. We just have to train our brains to think a different way, and eventually positive self talk will become a new habit for you. We are capable of so much more than we think!
