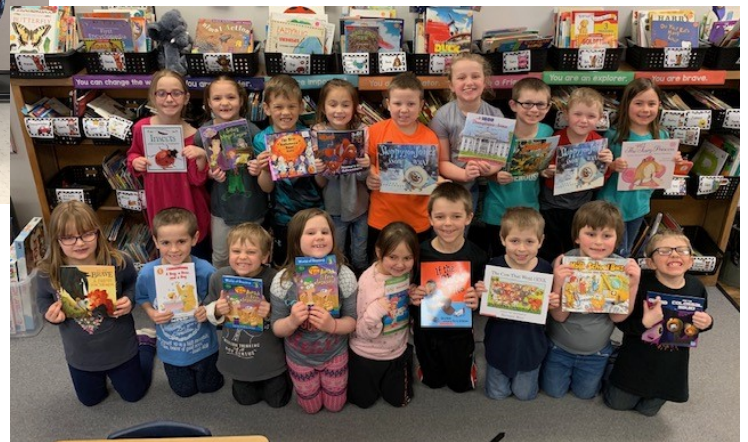

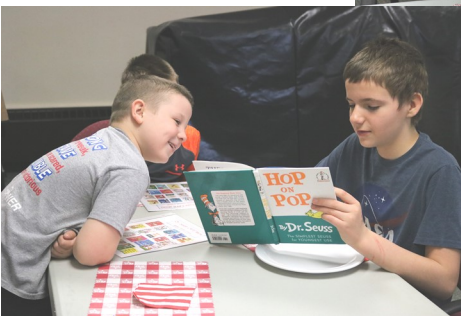
**PROGRESS REPORTS will be sent home Wed. April.3**
